



Study Abroad Travel Medical Insurance Summer 2006, Verano en Mexico

Your program fee for Summer in Guanajuato, Mexico includes medical insurance coverage through Acordia Somerton Student Insurance Services for the three weeks that you are in Mexico, June 18 – July 8, 2006.

The Value Plan included in the program fee covers medical expenses while you are outside the U.S. For an additional \$7 premium you can purchase the “Deluxe Plan,” which also includes coverage for certain athletic and hazardous activities, and a home country extension of benefits (see the Somerton booklet for a complete description of this coverage). If you wish to purchase Optional Coverage, add \$7.00 to the amount of your final payment.

If you plan to arrive in Mexico prior to June 18 or stay in Mexico after the program ends, and wish to be insured during that time you will need to purchase additional coverage.

INSTRUCTIONS: Complete the Enrollment Form enclosed in the Policy Booklet and return it to Global Affairs, Craven 5211 by the payment deadline, May 12, 2006.

NOTICE TO PARTICPANTS: The CSU Study Abroad insurance plan is designed to cover eligible medical expenses a student might incur while studying outside the United States. The plan offers medical insurance, which reimburses you for medical expenses incurred abroad, and a global emergency medical assistance service, offered through Assist America, which provides key services including, but not limited to: medical consultation and evaluation; hospital admission guarantee; emergency medical evacuation; critical care monitoring; and repatriation of mortal remains.

Be aware that Assist America services do not replace medical insurance during medical emergencies away from home. Assist America pays directly for services it provides, but does not reimburse for services that are not arranged through them. Therefore, students and their families should not arrange for any medical or emergency service, such as medical evacuation, except through Assist America.

Even though you have medical insurance that will reimburse you for medical expenses, you should be prepared to pay for medical care at the time it is rendered. While some medical providers may bill the insurance company directly, most providers and facilities will demand payment at the time of treatment. Therefore, you should have a credit card with you with a credit limit sufficient to cover basic medical emergencies.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT: I understand that if I need medical treatment payment must be made at the time of treatment and I will be reimbursed after filing a claim. I further understand that services provided under this policy by Assist America must be initiated through them and that I will not be reimbursed by Assist America for any service contracted by me or on my behalf.
