

**KINE 495—Internship in Kinesiology
California State University, San Marcos**

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Course Description: This course will focus on the practical application of principles and techniques related to Kinesiology. The course will provide the student intern with a forum to discuss policies, procedures, and practices within the industry and solve potential problems associated with the transition from student to professional. This class will not meet formally, but regular contact will occur between student and faculty member.

Prerequisite: Senior standing (> 90 credit hours), successful completion of KINE 326, and instructor consent.

Course Objectives: Each student will:

- 1) Maintain a biweekly typed journal of their Internship experience, including a description of any duties performed and progress made toward the completion of assigned projects. **Be insightful and recollect only the most interesting/novel experiences.**
- 2) Submit a professional resume and cover letter for job seeking/graduate school application—due by the 10th week of classes.
- 3) Complete a project pertinent to your Internship in consultation with your supervisor. Due by the 14th week of classes.
- 4) Gain meaningful career experience in the field of Kinesiology.

Department Expectations: You should represent our University and our Department with diligence and respect. All journal entries should be submitted on time, every two weeks, and email should be responded to in a timely manner. All submitted work should be THE BEST REFLECTION of your ability as a student, and should therefore be grammatically and technically correct.
